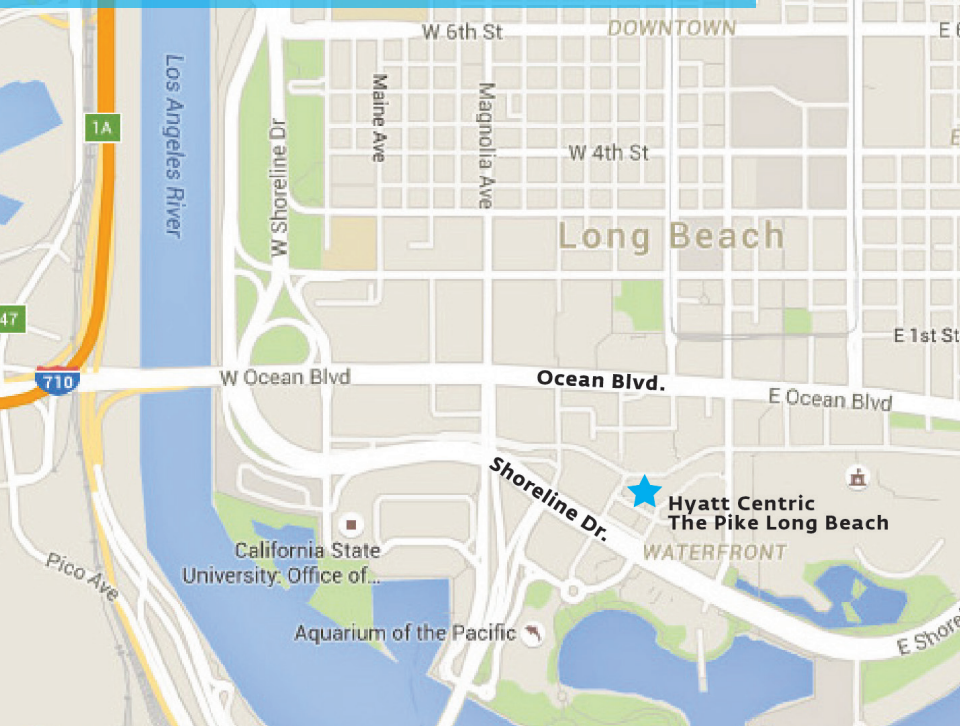

FROM I-710 SOUTH:

- Go towards the Downtown Exits
- I-710 South then becomes Shoreline Drive
- Go straight on Shoreline Drive West to Aquarium Way and turn left
- Take a left at Bay Street and follow to hotel

FROM OCEAN BLVD.:

- Turn south onto Pine Avenue
- Then turn right on W. Seaside Way
- Turn left onto Aquarium Way
- Take a right at Bay Street and follow to hotel
